

A new book, Media Relations and the Modern First Lady: From Jacqueline Kennedy to Melania Trump, contains a chapter by member Maurine H. Beasley. She examines the ways in which first ladies before Jacqueline Kennedy interacted with the news media of their day. The book is edited by Lisa M. Burns, professor of media studies at Quinnipiac University. It is published by Lexington Books. Burns is a former Ph.D. student of Beasley at Maryland.

Maurine H. Beasley will also receive the first Senior Scholar award given by the History Division of the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication at the organization's annual convention Aug. 7. The event was scheduled for San Francisco but is being held virtually this summer due to COVID-19. Beasley, professor emerita of journalism at the Merrill College of Journalism of the University of Maryland College Park, was nominated for the award by former students.
